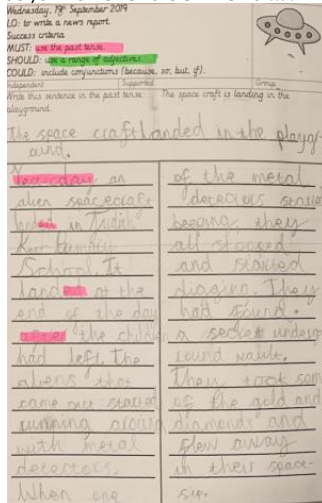
In year 1, we have been learning about the 5 Senses. We had to put Potato head back together again and label the five senses.

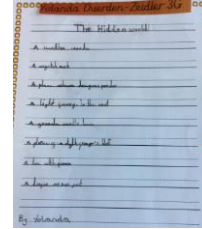

Year 5:

This week, Year 5 have continued with their book, Kensuke's Kingdom. They have been writing persuasive letters, and building their understanding of the main characters. In Science, they conducted an experiment to determine which material acted as the best filter for separating liquids and solids (sand in water). They hypothesized, then conducted their investigation and ensured it was a fair test by using the same amount of liquid and sand each time.

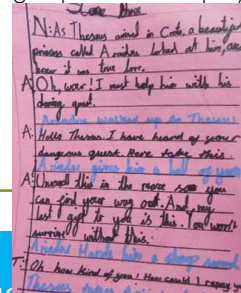


Year 6:

The time to apply for secondary school Year 7 entry September 2020, has arrived. Every child needs to complete a Common Application Form (CAF) for the borough where they live - not where they go to Primary school.

For example, if you live in Lambeth and attend Judith Kerr Primary, you will need to complete the Lambeth CAF.

By entering your postcode, this will take you directly to the right borough and their admissions page. You will need to complete an e-admissions form (online) by 31st October. Please note that some secondary schools require applicants to complete an additional supplementary form for their records. You will need to check the admissions information for the schools you are interested in, on their websites or by contacting the schools directly. Some schools inform you of this during open events.
