

Pupil Premium Grant Expenditure for 2019-20

Our job is to ensure that all children, whatever their ability, background and family income status, are given opportunities to learn according to their need. We use the Pupil Premium to assess and address specific needs brought about by social inequality, whether those children receive free school meals or not, or are a Looked After Child. Pupil Premium children will always receive appropriate intervention to support their learning and emotional well-being.

Pupil Premium funding will be allocated following a needs analysis, through pupil progress meetings which are held half-termly and which identify priority classes, groups or individuals.

Pupil Premium children may face barriers owing to Special Educational Need,
